I. 引言

「奧克蘭華人長老會」(ACPC)作為 「紐西蘭長老教會」(PCANZ)於「奧 克蘭市中心」(CBD)裡唯一的一間華人 教會,九十三年了,我們的教會情況如 何?你對「奧克蘭華人長老會」(ACPC) 感覺如何?你覺得我們的教會健康嗎?我 們的教會穩固嗎?在那一方面穩固?**屬靈** 上穩固抑或**睡得很穩固**?長老會的神學根 基應當是扎實和穩固的,但環顧我們四圍 的長老教會,許多長老教會已經失去了屬 靈的內涵,教會敬拜的人數寥寥無幾如同 風中殘蠋。我們發生了甚麼事?(參:牧 者感言,〈年度報告及事工計劃〉,2016)

Ⅲ. 長老教會:我們的傳統和價值

十 六 世 紀 的 新 教 改 革 (Protestant Reformation) 改變了整個基督教。路德 和其他改革者藉「五個唯獨」 (Five Solas) 重新陳述上帝的真理,讓人知道 基督教擁有解答人類重大問題的答案。茲 將「五個唯獨」 (Five Solas) 簡述如 下:

A. 唯獨恩典(Grace Alone)

「上帝使那無罪的,替我們成為罪, 好叫我們在他裡面成為上帝的義。」 (林後五 21)罪人的罪轉交耶穌, 耶穌的義轉交給罪人,這就是恩典。 這是唯一的方式,如果人在耶穌所 賜的恩典以上附加任何東西,就不 再是「唯獨」恩典了。

B. 唯獨信心(Faith Alone) 上帝藉耶穌的生和死所成就的愛的 禮物,是要人藉相信去接受的。聖 經說:「信就是所望之事的實底, 是未見之事的確據。古人在這信上 得了美好的證據。」(來十一 1-2) 又說:「……亞伯拉罕信上帝,這 就算為他的義。」(羅四 3,參創 十五 16)你只要信,就可得著耶穌 為全人類所預備的。得救的信心像 救恩一樣,也是上帝所賜的。經上 說:「你們得救是本乎恩,也因著 信。這並不是出於自己,乃是上帝 所賜的;也不是出於行為,免得有 人自誇。」(弗二 8-9)

- C. 唯獨聖經(Scripture Alone) 在我們這個年代,五個「唯獨」當 中以「唯獨聖經」最具爭議,人們 都不肯定是否仍有一條真理值得依 從。聖經已被等同為普通的一本書 刊。但聖經卻認為:「……預言從 來沒有出於人意的,乃是人被聖靈 感動,說出上帝的話來。」(彼後 一 21),耶穌說:「經上的話是不 能廢的」(約十35上),祂又說: 「……給我作見證的就是這經。」 (約五39下)。聖經是我們生活行 事為人的最高準則與權威。
- D. 唯獨基督(Christ Alone)

「願頌讚歸與我們主耶穌基督的父 上帝!他在基督裡曾賜給我們天上 各樣屬靈的福氣。……都是照他自 己所預定的美意,叫我們知道他旨 意的奧秘,要照所安排的,在日期 滿足的時候,使天上地上一切所有 的,都在基督裡面同歸於一。」

(弗一 3,9-10) 耶穌的門徒彼得 說:「除他以外,別無拯救,因為 在天下人間,沒有賜下別的名,我 們可以靠著得救。」(徒四 12)

「唯獨基督」是頭三個「唯獨」的 因。藉著基督我們才能得到「恩 典」,基督是我們「信心」(信靠) 的唯一對象,整本「聖經」都是與 基督有關的。 E. 唯獨上帝的榮耀(To the glory of God Alone)

「所以,你們或吃或喝,無論做甚 麼,都要為榮耀上帝而行。不拘是 猶太人,是希臘人,是上帝的教會, 你們都不要使他跌倒;就好像我凡 事都叫眾人喜歡,不求自己的益處, 只求眾人的益處,叫他們得救。」 (林前十31-33)

《偉斯敏斯德小要理問答》的第一 個問題:人生的首要目的是甚麼? 答案:人生的首要目的就是榮耀上 帝,並以他為樂,直到永遠。

- IV. 重塑我們的使命
 - A. 我們需要確認基督是主
 憑著在基督耶穌裡信心和神的恩典
 (唯獨基督、唯獨信心、唯獨恩典)
 - B. 我們需要宣揚祂的道 聖經[,]神的話是我們生活中最高的 權威(唯獨聖經)
 - C. 我們需要把祂的福音傳遍城市向萬 民作祂的見證 教會存在的目的,我們的宣教工場 和大使命(基督的大使命)
 - D. 我們的存在就是要榮耀上帝 我們活著的首要目的就是榮耀上帝 (唯獨上帝的榮耀)

故此[,]我們以「5 個唯獨」(Five Solas) 並耶穌的「大使命」(Great Commission)

重新確立了「奧克蘭華人長老教會」的 「唐令宫言」:

「使命宣言」:

確認基督是主,在城市中宣揚祂的道,並作萬民的見證,榮羅祂。

Acknowledge that Christ is the Lord and Proclaim His Word throughout the whole City as a testimony to all the nations, for His Glory.

弟兄姊妹,ACPC(Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church)不單只意味著我 們的身份,ACPC 也像徵著我們的傳統、 價值和使命!往後,若有人問你ACPC 指 的是甚麼的時候,你會否更加懂得向人介 紹我們的教會?

Why are We Here?

I. Introduction

The Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church (ACPC) has been the only Chinese church in the Auckland City Centre (CBD) as part of the "New Zealand Presbyterian Church" (PCANZ) for 93 years. How is our church situation? How do you feel about the "Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church" (ACPC)? Do you think our church is healthy? Is our church strong? In which areas are we strong? Are we spiritually strong or dormant? The theological foundation of the Presbyterian Church is solid. But look at the Presbyterian churches around us, many Presbyterian churches have lost their spiritual connotations, and the number of people worshipping in churches is declining. What has happened to us? (Ref. Minister's sharing, "Annual Report and Ministry Plan", 2016)

II. ACPC, we want to be ...

A. A Church with vision

Where there is no vision, the people are unrestrained...(Pr 29:18)

- B. A Church with dream
 Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth. (Col 3:2)
- C. A Church with growth but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect. (Ro12:2)
- D. A Church with direction
 Therefore I run in such a way, as
 not without aim; I box in such a
 way, as not beating the air; (1 Co
 9:26)
- E. A Church that isn't stale & stagnant
 So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth. (Re 3:16)

III. Presbyterian Church : our tradition & value The Protestant Reformation of the 16th century changed the whole of Christianity. Luther and other reformers re-stated the truth of God by "Five Solas", letting people know that Christianity has the answer to the question of major problems human has. Here are the "Five Solas" as follows:

A. Grace Alone

"God makes that sinless, sin for us, that we may be the righteousness of God in him." (2Cor5:25) The sin of sinners is transferred to Jesus, and the righteousness of Jesus is given to sinners. This is the only way that if a person adds anything above Jesus' grace, it is no longer a "pure" grace

B. Faith Alone

God's gift of love through Jesus' life and death is made for people to believe & accepted. The Bible says, "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. For by it the elders obtained a good report." (Heb11: 1-2) It is also said, "... Abraham believed in God, and it was counted unto him for "(Rom4:3cf righteousness. Gen15:16) As long as you believe, you will receive what Jesus prepared for all mankind. The faith that saves us, is like salvation, and is given by God. It is said in Bible: "You are saved by grace and by faith, and this is not of yourselves, but is given by God; nor by works, so that no man may boast." (Eph2: 8-9)

C. Scripture Alone In this era, the "Scripture Alone" is the most controversial among "Five Solas". People are not sure whether there is still a truth worthy of compliance. The Bible has been equated with an ordinary book. But the Bible says "For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." (2 Peter1:21) Jesus said, "The Scriptures cannot be broken." (John 10:35) He also said, "These are the Scriptures that testify about me." (John 5:39). The Bible is the highest standard and authority of our lives.

D. Christ Alone

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us every blessing of the Spirit in the heavens in Christ. ... Having made clear to us the of his secret purpose, in agreement with the design which he had in mind, to put into his hands, the ordering of the times when they are complete, so that all things might come to a head in Christ, the things in heaven and the things on the earth; even Christ "(Eph1:3, 9-10) Peter, the disciple of Jesus, said "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

"Christ Alone" is the reason of the first three "alone"s. Through Christ, we then get "Grace". Christ is the only object of our "Faith", and the whole Bible is all about Christ.

E. To the glory of God Alone "So, whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God. Do not cause anyone to stumble, whether Jews, Greeks or the church of God even as I try to please everyone in every way. For I am not seeking my own good but the good of many, so that they may be saved."(1 Cor10:31-33)

> The first question of "Westminster Shorter Catechism": What is the primary purpose of life? Answer: The primary purpose of life is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.

IV. Reshape our Mission

- A. Everyone needs to acknowledge that Christ is the Lord by Faith in Christ Jesus and through the grace of God (Christ alone, faith alone, and grace alone)
 - B. We need to proclaim His Word The Bible, the Word of God is the highest authority in our lives (Scripture alone)

- C. We will preach His Word and share the Gospel to the whole city as His testimony to all nations The purpose of the church, our mission and the great mission (the Great Commission of Christ)
- D. Our existence is to glorify God.
 The primary purpose of our life is to glorify God (To the glory of God alone)

Therefore, we have re-fined the Mission Statement of "Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church":

Acknowledge that Christ is the Lord and Proclaim His Word throughout the whole City as a testimony to all the nations, for His Glory.

Brothers and sisters, ACPC (Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church) is not only our identity, but it also symbolizes our traditions, values and mission! If someone asks you what ACPC stands for, will you know how to introduce them about our church?

V. Conclusion

This year is the fourth year I minister in Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church. I thank to the Lord for the Words of God reminding us "Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervour, serving the Lord. (Rom12:11) In the last four years, we have been trying to start off different ministries, in order to win more souls for the Lord. We ask the Lord to help us, not only to establish the mission and direction of our church, but also to be more diligent and courageous to fulfil the mission of the church in His mind.

English Minister's Report

It has been a great privilege to be one of the ministers of ACPC over the last 18 months. ACPC is a very important congregation within the Presbyterian Church of Aotearoa-New Zealand. ACPC is our "shop-front" to the Chinese community in Auckland. It is also the PCANZ's only congregation in the central city in the area, west of Queen St. Our English congregation is surrounded by thousands of people who speak over 160 different languages. This is exciting; it is a huge privilege as well as a major responsibility and challenge.

ACPC is an incredibly gifted group of people. It is a delight to be in a church where people work hard and do so creatively. It is important to develop each of our gifts without exhausting our people or overstretching our resources. Over the last year, the potlucks have been growing well, and now our available space is almost at its maximum. The dedication of our apple trees at Griffith Gardens has given us great opportunities to meet our local community, as have other activities, such as distributing Anzac biscuits along the street, donating bikes and sports gear to refugees and the gifts of socks to dads on Father's Day. Kathleen has begun her work as PA and Mission Assistant and is a very welcome addition to our staff. There are too many people to mention fairly but I do want to make special mention, if I may, of the contribution of Jean Wong wonderful contribution.

On open exchange of ideas and suggestions for the building developments is crucial for the future developments of our ministry and mission. We will need good facilities as we grow and as we develop Tea and Talk and in turn a Mandarin Ministry.

ACPC English Ministry is like an adapter plug. We are plugged in the eternal, unchanging, limitless "electrical" love and grace of God in Jesus Christ. At the same time, we are plugged in to the local community with all its different languages, cultures and ideas. We continue our ministry guided by our key verse, 1 Peter 3:15: "But in your hearts set aside Jesus Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give a reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect,"

Parish Council Report

We were blessed this year to welcome back on to the Parish Council: Martin Bing (EM), and Celia Wong (EM) and thank them for their continuing contributions to the running of our Church alongside our existing Parish Councillors. Our thanks also go to our Senior Minister, Rev Micah Tang, and EM minister, Rev Stuart Vogel (contract), for their dedicated service to the church.

The 2016/2017 year saw the establishment of the Ministry Settlement Board for finding a new permanent EM minister. Although the process has not yielded a suitable candidate to date we continue our efforts, and put our faith in God for an appropriate calling to be made.

We are pleased that Rev Stuart Vogel is also able to continue in the meantime on a half-time basis to minister to the EM, preach, provide pastoral care, and leadership and guidance in all areas of ministry. We also thank John Probert for being our regular pulpit supply.

Over the year we also welcomed a new part-time Mission and Administration assistant – Kathleen Chen to assist the senior Minister and EM minister in their work and to enable the church to be open during the week.

New Health & Safety requirements were considered on the Church and we now have lifted the focus of Health and Safety in ACPC with awareness, ongoing risk assessments and incident review and management processes in place.

For our children and youth workers we have also adopted protocols to train and certify them with the PCANZ Children and Youth Workers' WOF Training Day well attended by both the EM and CM youth leaders and Sunday School teachers.

Although the Parish Council has been focused on administration over the year, it has provided valuable input to the mission focus and work of the Cantonese Ministry and the English Ministry which have been the responsibility of the CM and the EM Leadership Teams. The ongoing work of the rolling 2-year Ministry Plans outline the focus and aims of the respective ministries.

A special highlight of the EM was the celebration of 500 years of the Protestant Reformation and 125 years of Chinese Christian mission in Auckland. We shared our history and our faith to the inner-city community on Sunday 6th August by planting two apple trees at Griffith Garden, the Auckland City Community garden on the corner of Albert and Wellesley Streets.

As we close out the 12 months to the next Parish Council we are now considering the ACPC future building options and are mindful of the work ahead.

The Parish Council is also most appreciative of the work of the leaders and members of both the CM and EM in furthering the kingdom of God and caring for His people.

We thank Rev Tang for his leadership, teaching, hard work and dedication to ACPC and its members. May God continue to bless him in his ministry and us all as we continue to strive to share the gospel with the people of Auckland

職青事工

感謝神的看顧!雖然有弟兄因為要回國 定居而離開職青組,神卻看顧及供應我們, 帶了五位新成員到我們當中。恆常出席人 數十人。

As we continue to seek God's Word and guidance for our congregation, we focus on building up our members in worship and discipleship, caring for each other, serving God and His church and caring for and reaching out into the community: the Central Auckland community, as well as our family and friends.

Home groups are an important part of church life: a place where pastoral care and studying God's Word go hand in hand. This year, our five home groups have all undertaken the same study of the meaning of church membership. Each group has then pursued studies based on their group's needs in their spiritual journey with various topics including Finding Joy in What we Do, Work and What to do with our Money, the books of Matthew, James, Romans and 1 Peter, Timothy Keller's Gospel in Life and Relational Evangelism. We have also started a midweek Christianity Explained group in one workplace.

In 1 Corinthians 12:14, we read "For the body is not one member, but many." – a clear statement about teamwork in the Bible. Being part of God's team helps us to live life in harmony and strength, so that we can do God's will in our personal lives as well as at church... and what a team we have.

Statement of Accounting Policies

Auckland Chinese Presbyterian Church For the Year Ended 30 June 2017

Basis of Preparation

ACPC has elected to apply Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual

(Not-For-Profit) PBE SFR-A (NFP) namely Tier 3 reporting on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses equal to or less than NZ\$2 million dollars.

All transactions are reported using the accrual basis of accounting and these reports are prepared under the assumption that ACPC will continue to operate in the forseeable future.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

ACPC is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of GST except for accounts payable and receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

ACPC is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows mainly comprise bank balances which include deposits on call.

Changes in Accounting Policies

Prior to 1/7/2015 expenses of a capital nature were expensed in the year of purchase regardless whether they were above the \$500 threshold. With effective from 1/7/2015 all expenditures of a capital nature above \$500 are capitalised and depreciated over the estimated useful life of the assets.

held at 12:30pm on 18th September 2016 at ACPC, 105 Vincent Street, Central Auckland, 1010

Business:

1. Introduction: Rev Tang welcomed the congregation to the meeting.

2. **Attendance**: Attendance records (attached) show 18 EM full members, 2 EM associate members, 33 CM full members and 2 CM associate members present. Total of 55 full and associate members present.

3. **Prayer**. Rev Stuart Vogel opened the meeting in prayer.

4. **Message from Rev Tang**: Rev Tang gave a message about the purpose and health of our church, based on his comments in the annual report. He noted that this was his third AGM as moderator. He talked about the history of the church over the last 93 years and asked us to reflect on whether we have fulfilled the purpose of the church. He showed slides with a five-year vision for ACPC based on concrete goals. The first goal concerned the growth of the church with targets for the CM and EM. The second goal was the employment of ministers and lay staff, with target staff numbers based on the size of the congregation. The third goal concerned the establishment of a church office. The fourth goal is to develop full-time ministers from within ACPC. The fifth goal is to establish a new Mandarin ministry at ACPC. The sixth goal is to improve ACPC's facilities.

5. Minutes of the 2015 Annual General Meeting: No concerns raised.

Motion: Approve minutes. Soo Land Wong moved, Jonathon Yu seconded. Passed unanimously.

6. **Election of Parish Council Members**: Candidates Martin Bing and Celia Wong were presented to the congregation. No concerns were raised over their appointment.

Motion: Appoint Martin Bing and Celia Wong to the Parish Council for a two-year term. Stephen Tsang moved, Tony Wai seconded. Passed unanimously.

Rev Tang reminded the congregation of their duty to support and pray for Parish Council members. Rev Tang and Rev Vogel committed the new members to God in prayer.

7. **Message from Rev Vogel**: Rev Vogel gave a message about the work of ACPC in the city, based on his comments in the annual report, including the metaphors of the kitchen and the adapter plug.

8. **Comments by Rev Tang**: Rev Tang made comments based on the CM ministry sharing in the annual report. He talked about the different emphases of the Cantonese and English ministries. While the EM is focused on outreach to the neighbourhood, the CM focuses on the friends and family of existing members and the growing university student group. He discussed the spiritual discipline of Bible-reading.

9. **Financial Report**: Tony Wai summarized the financial report in the annual report. Giving has decreased by 11% but the church surplus was more than budgeted, mainly because of Mark Maney's resignation in order to progress his path to ordination and rental income from the vacated church manse. We still have a healthy level of funds available both in cash and property.

10. **2016/2017 Budget**: Tony Wai presented the budget (which started in July). We are budgeting for a small deficit in this financial year as we invest more in the goals expounded by Rev Tang. In particular the budget provides for a part-time administrator.

Motion: Accept financial report and budget. Stephen Tsang moved, Coby Lin seconded. Passed unanimously.

11. **Other Business**: Soo Lang Wong expressed his concern about the composition of the new Parish Council, in particular the imbalance between members from the English ministry (4) and the Cantonese ministry (2), and encouraged Cantonese ministry members to put themselves forward next time. Rev Tang explained that Martin Bing and Celia Wong had the heart and ability to serve and no-one from the CM had come forward, and that the role of PC members is not to advocate for CM or EM but to work for the whole church. Rev Tang looks forward to continued spiritual and leadership development in the CM.

Rev Tang closed the meeting in prayer.
