

## Forgivenss Thinking Ahead

Sermon Notes

'You shall be near to me ... and ... I will provide for you.' Genesis 45:10-11 NKJV

We've read about how Joseph forgave his brothers and welcomed them back into the family. But he didn't offer token forgiveness then step back from the whole situation. No: he welcomed them back into relationship. How? Well, he was thinking ahead. His brothers would have been terrified of returning to their dad to let him know that Joseph was still alive and that they'd been deceiving him for 22 years. Joseph was a step ahead. He told them: 'Go up to my father and say to him, "Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt. Come down to me ... I will provide for you" (Genesis 45:9-11 NKJV). Rather than saying, 'Go confess your mess to dad,' Joseph said, 'Let him know I'm still alive, then come back with him and I'll care for you all.'

This was immensely wise for two reasons. (1) Dropping guilt onto someone who can't handle it is not what God's about when He tells us to reconcile. There's wisdom in knowing what to say and how to say it. (2) It brought the forgiveness home. Where his brothers expected blood and vengeance, they got a warm invite to be near to the brother they'd wronged. Joseph gave them an open door to full reconciliation. So what now? If you've taken the opportunity to forgive someone over the past few days, can you now go further and restore that relationship? See if you can meet up over lunch or dinner.
