

World Homeless Day – how can we help?



World Homeless Day this Monday 10th October, draws attention to homeless people's needs and provides opportunities for the community to get involved in responding to homelessness. This year, ACPC would like to help "Feel Good Period", an organisation connected with Splice who also help to cater to the number of homeless who are women.

For the next 2 weeks, it would be great if you could help by donating either:

- Female hygiene products – for distribution in Aotea Square the next day; or
- Money – where donations will be purchased for female hygiene products for distribution to those at the Auckland City Mission or Women's Refuge.

It's Impossible for Love to Fail
