The consequences of fretting

We know that Jesus (in Matthew 6) commanded us not to worry. But how harmful is worrying or fretting? Here is what the Bible says about it: Psalms 37:8-9 "(8) Cease from anger and forsake wrath; **Do not fret**; it leads only to evildoing. (9) For evildoers will be cut off... but those who wait for the LORD, they will inherit the land."



We think that fretting is so harmless! We stress out and become discouraged confessing that there's no way out of our terrible situation. But this type of spirit is not only harmful, it leads to evil! Did you ever think that worrying can lead to evil?

The opposite of fretting is to wait patiently, encouraged because you trust in the Lord. We must press into the Lord overcoming every hint of doubting – patient, trusting fully in our Father's love for us.
