

Nehemiah's Project

- **Burden:** demoralised people, broken-down walls (1:3)
- Request: Specific (2:2-4, 7-8). Vague goals and vague proposals produce vague responses! Two traps we often fall into regarding money and the church
- Arrival: What does he do first when he gets to Jerusalem? (2:12)
- "Pitch": How does Nehemiah inspire the people? (2:17-18). Vision: "A
 description of the ideal future". Nehemiah's dream was much bigger than
 literal walls around an earthly Jerusalem
- Opposition (2:19-20). How did Nehemiah respond to this opposition?
- Strategy: Break the project down into smaller chunks (Chapter 3)

The Complicating Factor: How did Nehemiah keep the people motivated to rebuild the wall? What is the most important thing? He aha te mea nui o te ao? He tangata. He tangata. He tangata.

The Church: Either a BOPSA: a Bunch Of People Sitting Around; or a POPTART: Purposeful, Organised People Together Achieving Remarkable Targets!

- 1. What upsets you about the state of the community / world?
- 2. What is your attitude to money and the church?
