
Mark 1:1-13

# Mark

- Shortest gospel
- First one written
- Not much is original
- Sense of movement -"immediately" 41 x
- Action-oriented
- Not much teaching
- Birth? Resurrection?



# Structure



- The man: <u>Identity</u>
- The mission: Suffering
- The origin: Galilee
- The destination:
   Judea

 Pivot point: Who do people <u>say I am</u>? (8:27-30)

# Author

- Anonymous but church tradition ascribes it to Mark
- "Mark, having become the interpreter of Peter, wrote down accurately whatever he remembered of the things said and done by the Lord, but not however in order."
  - Papias, Bishop of Hierapolis



#### Occasion

• ".. to scotch the rumour that the fire had been ordered by the Emperor himself], Nero substituted as culprits, and punished with the utmost exquisite cruelty, a class loathed for their abominations, whom the crowd styled Christians. Christus, from whom the name is derived, had undergone the death penalty in the reign of Tiberius, by sentence of the procurator Pontius Pilate. ... vast numbers were convicted, not so much on the charge of arson as for hatred of the human race. Every sort of derision was added to their deaths: they were wrapped in the skins of wild beasts and dismembered by dogs, others were nailed to crosses; others when daylight failed, were set afire to serve as lamps by night..."

#### The beginning

Mark is talking about his whole gospel

#### The Good News

- "In the religious world, the good news about Jesus Christ is watered down to good advice. People are told to be kind, to smile a lot, to love all creatures, to think positively, and to feel good about themselves. But the true gospel about Jesus Christ is something far more radical and explosive. It has to do with God's redemptive action in Jesus, which reveals God's love for humans and judgement on human sin and satanic evil."

- "Anointed one"
- "Sir, [Daniel 7] and similar passages of scripture compel us to await One who is great and glorious, and takes the everlasting Kingdom from the Ancient of Days as Son of Man. # Purpose

- Not a title Mark uses a whole lot
- The Messianic Secret
  - Jesus tried to keep his ID a secret for as long as possible to avoid the crowd hijacking his mission or the authorities speeding up his fate

- He is very closely identified with


# John the Baptist

- The first divinely appointed prophet for <u>400</u> years
- He is very closely identified with <u>Elijah</u>
- "Is it because there is no God in Israel that you are going off to consult Baal-Zebub, the god of Ekron?" <sup>4</sup> Therefore this is what the Lord says: "You will not leave the bed you are lying on. You will certainly die!" [This was relayed to King Ahaziah.] <sup>7</sup> The king asked them, 'What kind of man was it who came to meet you and told you this?' <sup>8</sup> They replied, 'He had a garment of hair and had a leather belt round his waist.' The king said, 'That was Elijah the Tishbite.'

### REPENTANCE

- To turn away from our <u>sins</u>
- To turn to God in <u>obedience</u>
- "Repentance means turning from as much as you know of your sin to give as much as you know of yourself to as much as you know of your God, and as our knowledge grows at these three points so our practice of repentance has to be enlarged."

### **ACCEPTANCE**

- Before Jesus had <u>healed</u> anyone or begun his public ministry, his Father <u>acknowledged</u> him and <u>expressed</u> his love for him
- One story expresses the idea of acceptance more than any other:
  - The Parable of the **Prodigal Son**
- God says of us, "I love you, I accept you, you are special just as you are and my Son died for you - receive my unconditional acceptance."
