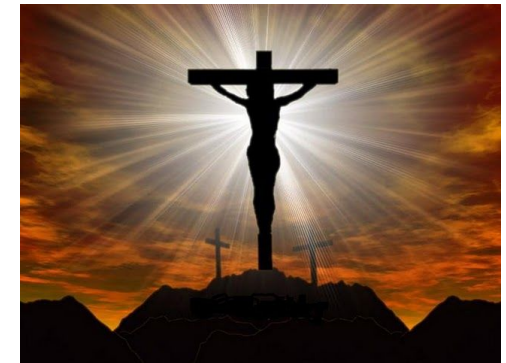

Churches and open doors

Until 1994, weddings had to be held in place with an "open door" and with free public access in case any one wished to object. Similarly, it has always been the case that Church worship services are a time of 'public worship' under Presbyterian regulations and anyone has the legal right to attend, providing they do not unduly disrupt proceedings. The doors therefore need to be open.

ACPC offers public worship as part of our core function to worship God. The Church Council would like to remind our congregation that commonly understood law and social practice as well as our wider church regulations need to be respected by keeping our doors (the front door especially) well open and welcoming at our services of worship.

Let's make sure that anyone who wants to worship God with us, can do so by keeping the doors open.
